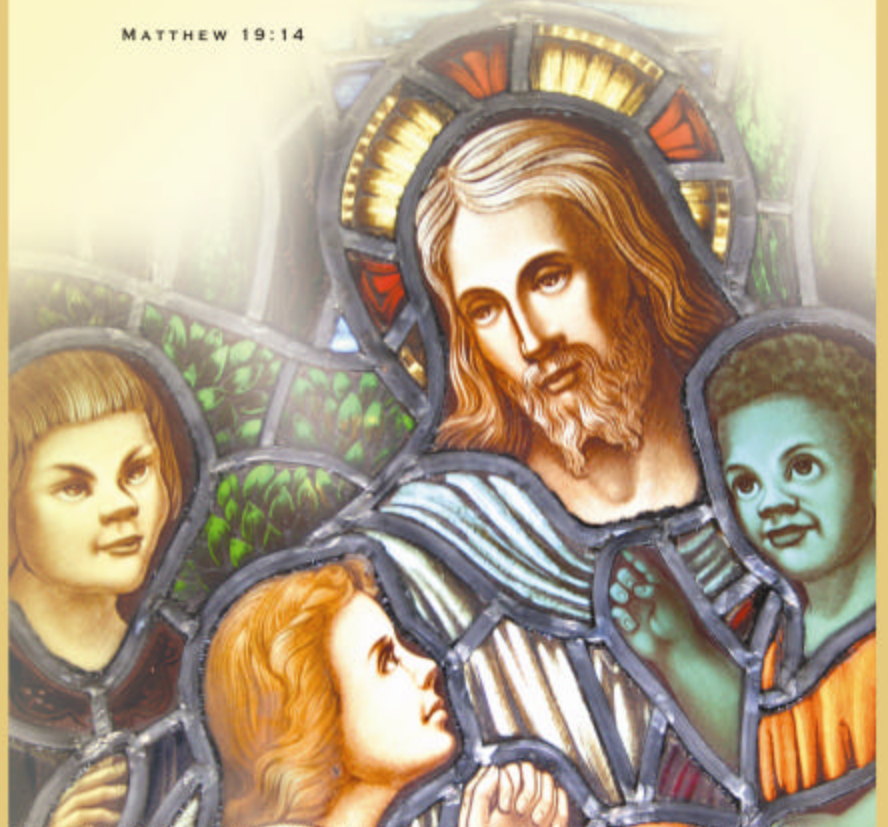

OUR MISSION STATEMENT

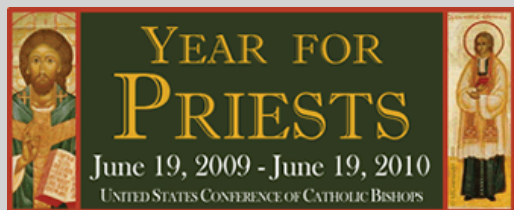

Dear Friends,

This is the weekend of **Welcome Back Day** when our school families get right to work in preparation for the new school year. I hope everyone is as excited as the staff is about the new windows on the south side of the school. Hopefully, this will engender some more excitement about the entire window project for Carnivale in 2010 and for our raffle. This window project will enhance the school, the PSR program, and will also include the fifty-year-old windows at the back of the church building. **Take a look through the windows from the outside and inside** for a special treat. Look especially through the stair windows on the west side of the school. You'll get a bird's-eye view of the cross on the rear of the church building. Enjoy.

Thanks again to the maintenance staff for getting the building spic-n-span and for all the hard work. A word of thanks goes to Mrs. Urban who spent her summer working so hard. Welcome back to our teachers and staff and students. This promises to be an exciting year spiritually, academically, and personally for all of us. Keep the school in your prayers. We look forward to a banner year. I also hope that you enjoy the parish picnic. A round of applause goes to all those who helped in any way from planning and coordinating to cooking (scouts), etc. God bless your efforts for a good time in late summer!

Our **pastoral staff day** together was an important moment for us not simply to go over specific agenda items of meetings and dates. Rather, this was a time for us to step back and reflect on the very foundation of our work and ministry together – the spreading of the gospel and the support of all our parish families and households. The Eucharist, of course, holds preeminent focus for us, but the future also includes formation and education, hospitality, social concern and outreach, working with the Parish Pastoral Council, following the guidance of the Parish Finance Council, looking to the directives of the Cluster Planning and Coordinating Team with ourselves and St. Chris, etc. Our pastoral staff is tremendous and so hardworking. The challenges, as you well know, for the future are likewise tremendous. Our parish is in such good shape due to the hard work of our staff and the support and involvement of the parish family itself. But we can never rest on our laurels. We need to keep moving forward and to engage all parts of the parish.

Are we perfect? Far from it. Do we make mistakes? Always. But our core direction as we listen to the Spirit and pray for the intercession of Saint Angela Merici does not waver. Let us continue to pray for one another. Remember your parish staff here. They are devoted and committed to you and to the work of the Church. Please thank them when you get the opportunity.

One aspect of that hard work surfaced with regard to the **Social Hall** and all the flood problems we had during

heavy rain downpours and cloudbursts. We (staff and finance and maintenance) were literally at our wits' end trying to find out what the problem was. The city of Fairview Park, experts in the field, and our own people tried very hard to help discover the problem. Alas, over the years as this parish grew, some of the decisions that were made decades ago did not always reach the stage of keeping accurate records. Finally, blessedly, one day not too long ago when we had a torrential rain, some plumbing experts were on premises and witnessed the flooding of the hall. By stroke of luck (or the guiding hand of Saint Angela) one fella noticed an odd "depression" over by the east side of the school. He poked at the asphalt, and lo and behold, he made a critical discovery: It seems that many years ago a cleanout (don't ask me the technical aspects of this) that is connected to the drain had been covered over, no doubt inadvertently by a company. When this cleanout was uncovered, it was searched. In the cleanout someone had placed a piece of plastic pipe (for lack of a more technical explanation) that had probably been put there to alert the asphalt people not to cover it over.

No such luck. It got stuck in the cleanout and gradually, over the years, went down, down, down into the drain and plugged up the drain. Thus, every time we had a downpour, the blocked drain couldn't handle the water, and **whammo**, we flooded. The terrible damage done some years ago was exacerbated by the huge rain (if you remember a couple of years ago) that closed all the freeways in Cleveland. But the regular flooding we got after that was caused by this obstruction in the line. Thankfully, when it was pulled out, **WHOOSH** – the hall drained as if you had pulled out a plug from your bathtub! Voila, problem solved. Thank you, Lord. We were facing some tough decisions and some awful digging if this discovery hadn't been made. And all this in the face of the tough economy. Amen. Alleluia.

So, it looks as if we are back in business down there. The Vacation Bible School didn't get a drop of water. Funeral lunches that had been on hold can now resume. Do we still get some water? Yes, in a place by the west lower entrance. We're thinking that it might be a cracked drain tile or something since this is the spot where the new and old church sections come together. But the water is nothing like it had been when the cleanout had been obstructed. Thus, our prayers were answered. Now you get another glimpse at how I spend my days!

I'd like to thank you all again for **keeping up** with our offertory during these times of economic stress. Your sacrifices are truly appreciated. I also want to thank those who use the online system of giving or who give monthly, etc. You may not see someone putting an envelope in the basket on Sunday. Remember that this person may be giving online or in another way. For those

who put in cash, I'd like to remind you to use your envelope. In this way we can help you to keep an accurate track of your charitable giving for **tax purposes**. We have no way of knowing that if you only put in cash. Cash is always welcome and is the usual mode for visitors, especially at our Sunday evening liturgy. **But registered parishioners should use their envelopes** if they don't use online or yearly giving or if they don't send in the offerings by mail. A significant number do send in their envelopes by mail, and we appreciate that, too.

F.Y.I. Sometimes our registered parishioners attend Mass at OLA or St. Chris. These parishes will forward your envelope back to us if you drop a St. Angela envelope in their baskets. We give the same courtesy for their people. A brother helped by a brother is a strong city. That goes for sisters, too!

Religious Orders of Priests

Religious priests receive duty assignments from their superiors in their respective religious orders. Some religious priests specialize in teaching, whereas others serve as missionaries in foreign countries, where they may live under difficult and primitive conditions.

Other religious priests live a communal life in monasteries, where they devote their lives to prayer, study, and assigned work.

Both religious and diocesan priests hold teaching and administrative posts in Catholic seminaries, colleges and universities, and high schools. Priests attached to religious orders staff many of the Church's institutions of higher education and many high schools, whereas diocesan priests usually are concerned with the parochial schools attached to parish churches and with diocesan high schools.

Members of religious orders do much of the missionary work conducted by the Catholic Church in this country and abroad.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion
