ST. ANGELA MERICI

St. Angela lived during the late 1400s in northern Italy. She began her close relationship with God as a young girl, and later formed a new religious "company" when she saw that the girls of her hometown were growing up with little education. Although it was never a religious order in her lifetime, Angela's Company of Saint Ursula, or the Ursulines, was the first group of women religious to work outside the cloister and the first teaching order of women. Angela died in AD 1540. Her feast day is celebrated on January 27.

Dear Friends,

The month of June is about complete for this year. We've been very busy with weddings, more than in previous years. I've already had ten in two months! Now that Fr. Greg is here, I gave him his "share" of future nuptials, so he'll be busy right off the bat!

Weddings are not limited to June, however. We have them all throughout the year it seems. While the penitential seasons of Lent and Advent are not necessarily recommended for a wedding, we can have them with some minor restrictions, e.g., limited days, limited decorations with flowers, etc. Normally, however, weddings are more festive during Christmas and after Easter, along with the Ordinary Season of the year. If someone wants to be married in the coming year, it is always wise to contact the church and the pastor many months in advance to insure that a couple can get the date they most desire. In fact, the policy of the Diocese of Cleveland is that a couple must contact the parish church at least six months in advance to complete all the necessary work that must be done.

Marriage preparation in the diocese covers not only the wedding ceremony but reflections on the sacrament of Matrimony itself. You might want to check out the bishops' Web site regarding marriage (www.usccb.org) and our own diocese's Web site (www.clevelandcatholiccharities.org/mfm) for marriage and family ministries. These sites can be very helpful for those wishing to be married and for those who want to investigate resources regarding divorce recovery, stepfamilies, and a host of topics that relate to family life today. All these programs fall under the aegis of **Catholic Charities**. This is another marvelous way that our contributions to Catholic Charities make such a positive difference in the lives of so many people in the eight counties of the Diocese of Cleveland.

The **Year of St. Paul** officially closes on the 29th of this month, the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. This has been a great year to focus our reflections on Paul in our many parish activities. Thanks to all who took time to participate in adult education, GIFT, and in school, YOSA, and PSR. Michael Schwark and Linda Heiss, along with many others, took the lead in helping all of us to deepen our awareness of Paul's impact in our lives. Many thanks to all.

Now we have the **Year For Priests** that began on June 19th, the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. I hope that you will take time to reflect on this year's worldwide focus as outlined by the Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI. Priests are certainly mindful of our need to update and to renew our

ministry and our very lives. All the faithful in the Church throughout the world can take this year as a grand opportunity of grace to pray for priests who serve the needs of every Church member and to pray for much needed vocations to the ordained ministry of priesthood. One practical way this year will be for us to welcome our seminary intern for the coming academic year. He will be engaged in a similar program as the seminarian we had last year, Terry Grachanin. I haven't been told the young man's name yet, but will share it with you when I hear. By the way, plenary indulgences are also available this year as proclaimed by the Church. The usual stipulations apply. Those who are homebound also have the opportunity to receive a plenary indulgence, too. Basically, being a person of prayer for the Holy Father will just about cover all that you need to do. If you have any questions, call me.

I am always hopeful, though, that one day soon we will have some young men of our parish "take the plunge" and seriously consider a life as a priest in our diocese or in a religious order or congregation. St. Angela has had such a great history of providing priests for the Church. **We need to continue and support that goal once again in this year/era of the Church's history.** Our centennial, by the way, is not too far away. We will be 100 years old in 2026. If we had a vocation a year for the next several years, can you imagine the joy we would share in celebrating with young priests — sons of the parish — during that centennial? I hope that parents will spend some time with their sons in talking about such a vocation. Grandparents, godparents, aunts and uncles — you, too, can have a profound effect on the young members in your lives, as well. Our Avilas group prays for such vocations every day. Let's join them this year especially. Take a look at the window in honor of the **Curé d'Ars**, better known as Saint John Vianney, in our church. He is the patron of parish priests and the patron of this special year. The French word for parish priest was *Curé*, meaning the one who had the care of souls in his parish. So St. John Vianney had the care of the souls in his parish in the city of Ars. Hence, Curé d'Ars. Mais oui. Sans blague! (No kidding!)

That's about it for this week. I hope that everyone had a great Father's Day celebration as we remembered our dads. This week we pray for our country on its 233rd birthday, the birth of independence by the proclamation of the Declaration back in 1776. The federal holiday is

Challenge your youngsters to see if they know the original title for Los Angeles in California. They may be surprised!

May God bless our nation, our president, civil leaders, and all our citizens. We pray that the civil authority in our country continues to reflect on the best ways to build up society in a spirit of truth, justice, solidarity, and freedom. We hope that we as Catholics may assist our country by our work of evangelization, a work that may shed the light of the Gospel on men and women's search for God and for what is truly human. The call and obligation to respect the fundamental rights of the human person and the conditions for the exercise of true freedom never change. We thank God that we may continue this work in our day, standing on the shoulders of our friends and families and neighbors who have done so much to make our country a beacon of optimism in the world. Oremus pro invicem. Soli Deo Gloria. On to the celebrations for freedom. I'm not quite sure how our kitty, Izzy, will react to fireworks in the neighborhood since this will be our first 4th together. We'll have to see. Perhaps some catnip will lessen the tension. Happy Fourth of July! Be safe.

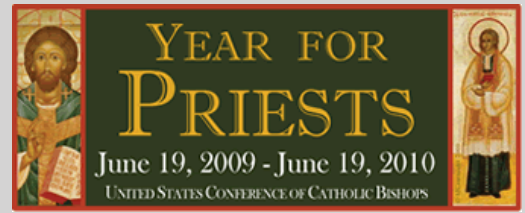

**SPECIAL INDULGENCE FOR THE
YEAR FOR PRIESTS**

The *Plenary Indulgence* is granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant who, in church or in chapel, devoutly attend the divine Sacrifice of Mass and offer prayers to Jesus Christ the Eternal High Priest, for the priests of the Church, and any other good work which they have done on that day, so that he may sanctify them and form them in accordance with His Heart, as long as they have made expiation for their sins through sacramental confession and prayed in accordance with the Supreme Pontiff's intentions: on the days in which the Year for Priests begins and ends, on the day of the 150th anniversary of the pious passing of St John Mary Vianney, on the first Thursday of the month or on any other day established by the local Ordinaries for the benefit of the faithful.

The *Plenary Indulgence* will likewise be granted to the elderly, the sick and all those who for any legitimate reason are confined to their homes who, with a mind detached from any sin and with the intention of fulfilling as soon as possible the three usual conditions, at home or wherever their impediment detains them, provided that on the above-mentioned days they recite prayers for the sanctification of priests and confidently offer the illnesses and hardships of their lives to God through Mary Queen of Apostles.

Lastly, the *Partial Indulgence* is granted to all the faithful every time they devoutly recite five *Our Fathers*, *Hail Marys* and *Glorias*, or another expressly approved prayer, in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, to obtain that priests be preserved in purity and holiness of life.

This week, we will look at logging on to the Web site if you forgot your username and/or password and how to change your profile once you are logged on...

In your Internet browser's address bar, type *www.virtus.org*, and hit enter.

On the left side of the page, click on "Forgot your password? Click here."

Enter your Virtus Web site User ID (if you remember it) or your email address and select "Go."

Your password will be emailed to you shortly and you will be able to log in.

If you do not know your User ID or the email address you registered with, but you know you did register once with this Web site...

Call Michael at the Parish Center and I can check to see if you ever registered online. I can email your information and password directly from the Web site to your email and/or change any of your information.

or

Call Virtus at 888-847-8870. This is a very friendly and helpful service. You can speak directly with a person right away. He/she can look up your account, change your User ID, tell you your password and/or change your login information.

When you have your User ID and password...

In your Internet browser's address bar, type *www.virtus.org*, and hit enter.

Enter the User ID and password in the spaces provided on the left side of the page and click "Login."

Your full name and "Diocese of Cleveland, OH" should appear on the right side of the page.

In the top right hand corner, click on "Update my Account."

You can change any of your personal information and your password on this page. Click "Save" at the bottom of the page.
