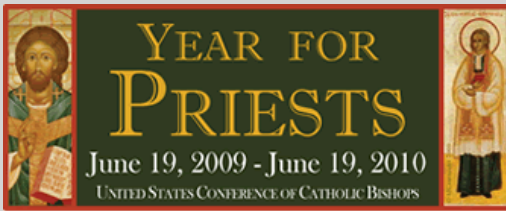

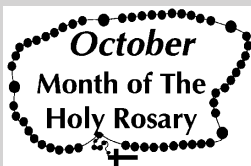

Dear Friends,

**October** is the month of the **rosary**, of **respect life**, but also the month of Saint **Francis** of Assisi, the saint who loved God's creation with his entire being. How apt it is at this time, then, when colors brighten the trees and the world turns to a new season that we take time to **bless pets** – those little creatures who bring such joy and love into our lives and who remind us of God's mysterious and limitless creative power and imagination.

Our little Izzy in the rectory does that all the time for us. I heard from a friend of mine in NYC who recently lost his wife. His sadness is, of course, palpable, but he recently acquired three kittens to help him out. He had always liked cats but couldn't keep them due to other family members' allergies. Alone now, he has three: **Streak**, who is black with white racing stripes in his fur and a white handlebar mustache to complete the ensemble; **Cozy**, a calico cat who is very feminine according to her owner; and finally **Jenny**, a grey tabby who was named after a beautiful Kurt Weill song of the same name. My friend has a creative mind and a way with words. Have fun and good luck with your new "family" of cats.

I have a few things to share this week. Here we go:

Extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion who have attended their renewal training session or their first training session should come to see me or Fr. Greg in the sacristy **after Mass to be commissioned** and to receive your certification. Some have not done so yet; please help us to complete this process. If you want to be an EM, we'd love to help you. See us. Also, we need people to be courageous and sign up for this ministry at Mass. Help your fellow Catholics to receive Christ and help us to have a balanced Mass in terms of time. The more EMS, the more balanced the Mass' duration!

I see that the **E-Z Pass** is now available in Ohio. What a great tool to make your commutes shorter on the turnpike and in other states. I've seen it in action in NY, IL, and PA. Remember to **slow down** when driving around the church property. You never know when a young child or scout or adult might be crossing just around the corner. Obey the signs; don't go over 5 m.p.h. PLEASE.

The Communal **Anointing of the Sick Mass** is October 18<sup>th</sup> at 2pm. Please consider coming or helping someone infirm to come. We'll have several priests to help us. It will "count" as your Sunday obligation, too!

Over the past weeks, we have had several funerals as you know. By sheer coincidence, three funerals of recent weeks have been the grandparents of three of our 8<sup>th</sup> graders. I hope that you will keep these young people in your prayers. How hard it is to lose a parent and a beloved grandparent! Our young people need our prayers and our **assistance in overcoming the grief that comes from separation**. Don't forget to share your thoughts and faith with young people who need our guidance in this and in all matters. No one can really do it alone. And often, people don't know how to ask for the help that they need. Even those young ones who didn't lose a grandparent will be wondering all about this. Don't be afraid to speak to any of our young people with age-appropriate language and ideas.

Our next **cluster meeting** (Cluster Planning and Coordination Team Meeting) will be held on October 8<sup>th</sup>. All is going well with St. Christopher and our parish regarding youth groups, strengthening Mass attendance, supporting our schools, and working for evangelization. Keep us in your prayers.

We have had our regular Parish Pastoral Council and our Finance Council meetings of late. All is going well. Please be aware of the work of these councils and speak to your council members whenever you wish. Our PPC is working hard to keep us informed, especially re outreach to others through the Social Justice Commission and our cluster partner. The FC has approved our budget for next year; we'll give you a report of the last year in the coming weeks.

As many parishes do around this time, we'll be mailing you information on the coming year's offertory. Your generosity this past year has been so heartening as you support our parish family and all its activities. Before the new calendar year begins, we'll be asking you again to make your **annual pledge to the parish** as you are able – what you will be giving to the church weekly or monthly or yearly as you prayerfully determine this for you and for your family. If you can increase your offering, we will be most grateful. This communiqué is different from last year's enhancement request.

**PASTOR'S LETTER, CONTINUED**

This year we will simply be asking what you will be able to give so that we can intelligently plan our budget for the future. Thanks in advance.

In conjunction with St. Christopher Parish we are starting an **Evangelization Committee** to help us reach out to others and share our faith in Jesus with the surrounding neighborhood. Maureen Sweeney Loftus has graciously offered to chair this committee at its beginning. If you are interested in helping her and joining in the work of evangelization, please let us know.

We will also be looking at a **new Stewardship Committee** to help us move into the future on solid footing. More on this in the future. Stewardship deals with our offering to God our time, our abilities, and our sharing in the financial burdens of parish life. What are we willing to commit to in our lives as members of the parish? Stewardship is the term we use to encompass all these concerns. Watch for more about this in the future.

Our seminary intern, **Tim Roth**, will be speaking to our parish the weekend of October 24-25 regarding the priesthood and vocations. That is the weekend of **National Priesthood Sunday**, so I hope you will welcome him and his thoughts that he will share with us. This is the Year for Priests. Please keep us in your prayerful regard.

For your calendar planning, Fr. Greg and I will be gone to Columbus on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> of November to attend the all-Ohio **priest's convocation** in Columbus. This is a meeting of all priests from the six dioceses of Ohio, and Bishop Lennon would like us to attend to hear the talks on the sacraments, especially Matrimony, and to share our common priesthood with our brother priests across the state.

Have you thought about Confirmation yet if you haven't been confirmed? Remember, you cannot be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation if you haven't been confirmed yourself – a Church law for the whole world. Let's get everyone confirmed who needs this wonderful sacrament of our faith.

I hope our engaged couples are watching the bulletins and the notices regarding marriage prep classes throughout the diocese. Some local parishes do offer this, and it would be most

convenient to take care of this wonderful preparation nearby.

Keep praying for **vocations** to the priesthood, diaconate, and religious life during this year for priests. Also please remember the new Synod of bishops for Africa who will be meeting under the theme, "**The Church in Africa**, at the Service of Reconciliation, Justice, and Peace" during October 4-25. Their aim is to develop a strategy and a program of action for the Catholic Church (160 million members in Africa), the world's second largest and second-most populous continent after Asia. The Church needs to promote and help bring about reconciliation, justice, and peace among the peoples of this continent who are plagued by poverty, interethnic violence, and wars. Oremus.

Try to pray the rosary this month. You can even look on the Internet to help you or even YouTube to assist you. And don't forget to pray for life and pray for those preparing for marriage. John Paul reminded us that the very creative nature of marriage acknowledges God's act of creation, His overflowing love and His plan for humanity – a plan modeled in the sacrament of Matrimony. It reveals a mystery of infinite value: the gift of divine life. Marriage is the deepest and most profound of human communions, a sign of that divine communion.
