As I write today, the snow crackles and crunches underfoot. I want to also remind you that we have set a tentative date to join in the **Centennial Celebration of Fairview Park** this year. We are planning an ecumenical prayer service with other local congregations on **September 8, 2010**. Please mark your calendars. In this way, we hope to gather and thank God for the blessings of the past century and ask for His guidance in the century to come. Our own parish centennial will be in 2023, a mere few years away. If I last that long, I'll be 72 years old. I can't even begin to think about it! As you might suppose, I have a few other ideas up my sleeve to commemorate our one hundred years together. Besides the strengthening of our school, our outreach, our PSR, our adult formation sessions, etc., I'd like to clean up some other areas that need refurbishing in the parish. E.g., someday in the future we need to do something to bring our **Parish Center front office** into the 21st century. The cramped quarters and current configuration are just not suitable for serving people who come to our offices and for those who work here. I am always concerned about security and safety as well. Newer parishes had the advantage of designing their work spaces to meet contemporary needs. Our building is actually the original church and convent building. What I'd like to do someday is to refigure the office and enlarge it east to west by utilizing the current

waiting room into a larger space, thus affording comfort and security at the same time. Again, this is **a dream for the future** when windows have been done, school is secure, etc.

Another idea for the future before our centennial would be to look at our church south **vestibule/entrance and the lavatory there**. The beautiful leaded-glass windows in the back could possibly be transformed using the existing glass and wood into French door-type panels that could be moved to open or close depending on the Mass or wedding etc. That way people could see into the church who are standing back there, and young parents with fussy children could also see into the church while caring for their youngsters. A clear lexan-type material would keep the vestibule **soundproof but visibly accessible** as the doors would open and close for Mass, weddings, and all celebrations as needed. Interesting?

The bathroom/lavatory presents different challenges. It is a very well-used room, but it needs some thought to keep it sanitary and user-friendly. **Any ideas?** And finally, with all the beautiful stained-glass that is up for sale from closed/merged churches in our diocese, I would love to see some of that beautiful art as part of our window replacement in the new section of the church on the north end. We have many windows to replace in the sacristy, hallway, community room, etc. Wouldn't some use of stained glass in these spaces truly enhance these rooms? You can see the materials that are available by logging on the diocesan inventory site at www.church-inventory.com for the Diocese of Cleveland. Very interesting to say the least. Such treasured heirlooms of these communities and of the diocese could be placed here as a living legacy of faith. *A wildly successful raffle could do the trick. Ahem.*

I'll be quiet now. Have a great week. Thanks again for all your support. Let's remember to look around at Mass and be alert to **welcoming** and helping someone who might be joining us for the first time at the liturgy. It would do so much. Some people have asked me about Izzy the kitty lately. She is fine and meowing up a storm at every possible chance she has. **Oremus pro invicem. Soli Deo Gloria.**
